## Enthusiasm and Innovation

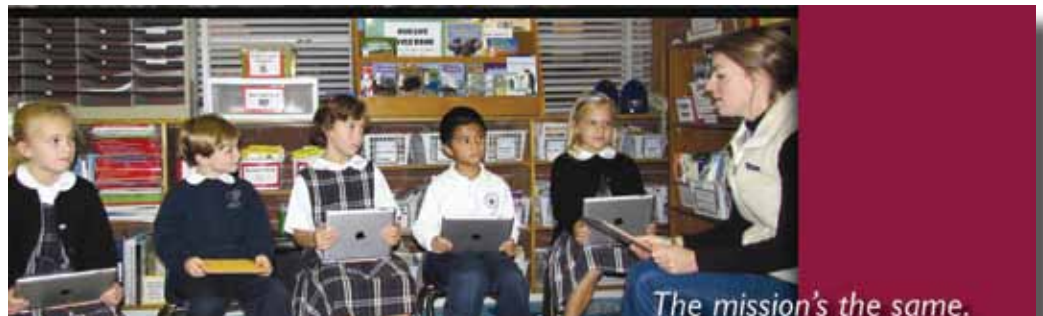


For the last three months I have marveled at the enthusiasm and innovation of the hardworking teachers at Sacred Heart Cathedral School while observing K-8 and special classrooms. How impressive to watch kindergarteners construct number lines, add, and subtract on **SmartTables**. Using **iPads**, third graders learn how to count money and make change; while fourth graders research the three branches of government. In the middle school, seventh graders using **laptop computers** conduct research for the science fair, and the sixth graders compose essays and receive teacher comments sent directly to their computer screens before they submit their final copies. **SmartBoards** are used throughout the school to show video clips of historical events, solve algebraic equations, and review vocabulary words.

Special area teachers, in addition to teaching course objectives, strive to instill a life-long appreciation of the arts as they study **theater**, different media in **art**, and a variety of **music** and instruments. In the gym, there is an emphasis on physical fitness as a life-long goal and instruction in sports like **golf** and **fencing** that can be enjoyed throughout adulthood. As our teachers use new technology, students exhibit excitement and success as each new concept is mastered. The times may have changed, and the addition of technology may make classrooms look different, but the school's mission and the awe and joy on a child's face when learning occurs is still a sight to behold!

## Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Being 'in the zone' or 'in the groove' are just a few colloquial terms used to capture the exhilarating feeling experienced when emotions and actions are channeled and aligned with the task at hand. Psychologists refer to this as flow: a mental state of operation in which a person in an activity is fully immersed in a sense of energized focus, complete involvement, and total commitment to the success of the activity or endeavor. At the risk of committing the sin of pride, I just can't help but share how our Sacred Heart Cathedral School has definitely been 'in the zone' this semester!

Thanks to an enormously successful Annual Fund campaign last year, our students returned to school with a plethora of technological tools including iPads, laptops, interactive SMART Boards and SMART Tables. These tools have ignited a renewed zeal for learning with teachers and students!

Our fall athletic teams have demonstrated outstanding ability on the various fields and courts. For example, the Varsity Tennis team completed an undefeated season culminating in their first ever city-county championship. Our Girls' Varsity Soccer team recently completed their second straight undefeated season and second straight city-county championship. Individual students on the Cross Country team had record-breaking runs throughout the season and even participated in the Cross Country National Championships.

In all areas throughout the school, our priests, teachers, parents and students have focused energy and harnessed a concentrated effort in the service of performing and learning. We have embarked on new ventures such as serving breakfast in the school cafe, and offering students additional enrichment opportunities such

as "Mornings in Motion", an early morning physical exercise program, or an after-school English language enrichment opportunity.

In addition, our parish has been actively involved in creating a new strategic plan. The parish's commitment to the school ministry could not be stronger! Our parish founders are the reason for our school's existence and our present parish family is so important to our future success. This new found synergy between the parish and school is exciting. One of the goals of the plan is to identify specific ways to increase parishioner involvement within the school through spiritual formation and active service in school ministry.

In his letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul provided the beautiful metaphor of the Church to the human body. "Now the body is not a single part, but many...God placed the parts, each one of them in the body as he intended." Through this metaphor, St. Paul described the cohesive flow of all parts of the body serving and doing its specific role to make the body perform as God intended—a perfect creation. Now, that is what I call being 'in the zone'!

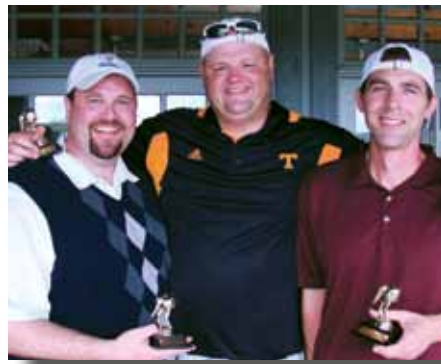

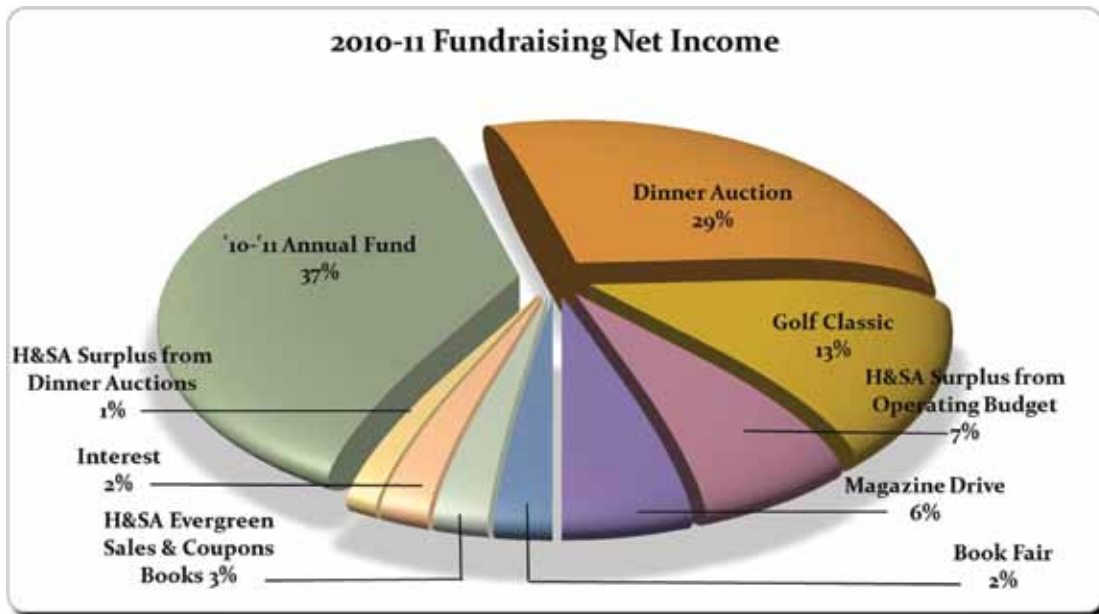

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## See the Face of God in All - 7th Grade

Each year, Sacred Heart Cathedral School chooses a theme that provides a common school-wide focus. This year's theme is "See the face of God in all."

The Seventh Grade team (Mr. Bodie, Mrs. Hook, Mrs. Macrae, Mrs. Townsend and Sister Maureen) developed a program to help students 'see the face of God in all' through special class projects.

In October, the students began gathering plants, soil and tools for a gardening trip to the Salvation Army's Red Shield Community Garden. The garden is a new initiative that supplies food for the Salvation Army kitchen and food pantry. The students loaded up all their materials on busses and headed out to the garden. With direction from Yvonne Yates of the Salvation Army, the classes dug trenches, moved soil, formed ponds, removed summer plants, installed fall vegetables, raked and potted. Each student was immersed in the project

and helped make a vision a reality.

On December 6th, the seventh grade embarked on a trip to the Salvation Army warehouse to provide assistance with stocking over 1,500 food boxes, sealing them and stacking them on pallets. The students were placed in teams of four to organize hundreds of toys, games, clothing, shoes and food. The seventh grade witnessed just how many people in Knox County are in need and will benefit from the Salvation Army's Angel Tree program. Major Vic of the Salvation Army was amazed at the accomplishment of this massive project!

Based on these service experiences, the students wrote reflections in light of the theme "See the Face of God in All." Some of those reflections stated, "This project has impacted the way that I live now"; "I don't take anything for granted"; "I thank God that I have this warm meal"; "I spent so little time making so much difference".

The seventh grade "See the Face of God in All" program will culminate this spring with a concert directed and produced by Sacred Heart's middle school music director, Mrs. Townsend.

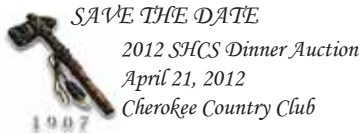
